

### - Our Mission -

Access propels middle school students who have been historically underserved through high school and on to college and career success with enrichment, counseling, and scholarships.

### - Our Vision -

A vibrant St. Louis community where equity in education allows every child to think, dream, and achieve big.

### THIS YEAR, ACCESS ACADEMIES:



Supported **454** students — from middle school through college — with individualized mentoring, guidance, and advocacy.



Guided 40 eighth graders from our three partner middle schools into one of 9 best-fit collegeprep high schools.



Funded over \$724,000 in high school tuition scholarships and registration, technology, and testing fees so that 159 students could attend private, partner high schools.



Organized and led 9 college visits for more than 139 Access eighth graders and high school students.



Awarded 70 collegians the Access College Scholarship — worth up to \$6,500 per student over their college career. Access has provided over \$155,000 in college scholarships since 2020.

### **MENTORS IN MOTION**

MIM is a mentorship and leadership development program that inspires, educates, and empowers youth through music, technology, and innovative arts. By guiding students through the process of writing, producing, and recording songs, creating music videos, and designing and marketing apparel, this dynamic program fosters artistic expression and creativity while cultivating essential life and job skills.



### SISTER THEA BOWMAN ROBOTICS TEAM

The Bow Botz Robotics Team has been building robots and competing at the Clavius Robotics Jamboree since 2016. The Clavius Project, a STEM program developed by students at Saint Louis University High School, exposes students to robotics, programming, and 3D printing. This year, 32 schools from the Saint Louis area participated in the annual Jamboree held at SLUH. The Bow Botz, led by Mary Migalla, brought 22 students to the event and earned a "Gold with Distinction" ranking.



### SISTER THEA BOWMAN CATHOLIC SCHOOL CHOIR

A popular offering in Access' extended-day enrichment program, the Sister Thea Bowman Catholic School Choir was founded in 2004 as an integral part of the school's Education Through Music and the Arts Program. It's directed by Ms. Vera Boldin, a retired educator with a rich background in music, and performs regularly at Friday mass and other churches, community events, and galas across the Metro East.



# - 2024 Pillar Award Winner - MARY MCGEATHY

The Access Academies Pillar Award celebrates an individual who enthusiastically reflects our dedication to giving every student, every chance, every day. This year's winner is Ms. Mary McGeathy, a middle school teacher and former principal at Sister Thea Bowman Catholic School.

Since arriving at Sister Thea Bowman in 2004, Mary has been a guiding force in shaping the educational landscape for her students. She played a pivotal role in integrating special programs like arts and music, extended day, and liturgical dance into the school's curriculum, as well as in launching the Access program in 2018.

In addition to her daily teaching responsibilities, Mary helps plan and supervise the Access after-school enrichment program, runs the reading and writing workshop and book club, and teaches yoga and mindfulness. She's passionate about lifelong learning and can often be found playing the violin, singing in the choir, or dancing alongside her students. A beacon of inspiration for both students and staff alike, Mary's steadfast commitment to the Access mission and her tireless efforts to enrich the lives of those around her continue to leave an indelible mark.

# - Empowering Students Across the St. Louis Region Since 2005 -

Access Academies partners with 26 private, college-preparatory schools and has supported students in more than 47 local high schools across the St. Louis region. This academic year, Access served 454 students in 3 partner middle schools, 38 area high schools — including 20 private, college-preparatory schools — and 49 colleges and post-secondary institutions across the country.

\*Access Academies' high school graduation rates for both African American (99%) and Hispanic (96%) students exceed the national averages for both racial and ethnic groups, as well as the graduation averages for schools in St. Louis City (including St. Louis Public Schools and St. Louis Charter Schools), which are less than 90%.

Access provides over 1,035 hours of high-quality after-school and summer enrichment programming to our middle school students each year, a support that promotes student achievement, encourages positive behavior, and expands their definition of success. Our donors can be confident that their support is making a lasting difference. According to the Afterschool Alliance, "Afterschool programs also provide a significant return-on-investment, with every \$1 invested saving at least \$3 through increasing youth's earning potential and improving their performance at school."\*
